GENERAL APPROACHES FOR ACTIVE READING

- Keep a good dictionary close at hand. Look up any word you don't absolutely understand.
 - o There is nothing wrong with using the dictionary on your phone.
- Make notes in the margins or take thorough notes separately.
 - o Remind yourself of what you were thinking at the moment of reading.
- Look for patterns (metaphors, imagery, plot devices, language, etc.) and consider why they are present. What effect does the pattern have?
- Consider what you bring to the reading.
 - o Make connections between what you are reading and what you have previously read.
 - o Make connections between your world and the world of the book.
- Consider what you know or think you know about the text before reading it.
- Inspect the text. How does it meet/challenge your expectations of a literary text?
